

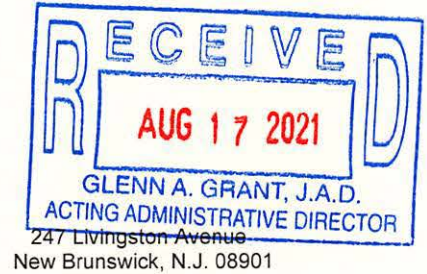

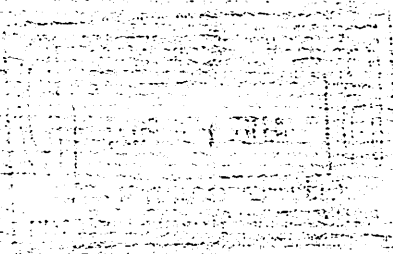

**Re: Future of Court Operations**

Dear Judge Grant,

Although I can appreciate all the problems created by the COVID-19 Pandemic, the future of the Criminal Justice System should not be compromised for the sake of efficiency. All of us, including the Administration of the Courts should remember why we went to law school and the idealism we all believed in when we graduated law school. That altruism is what should control how we proceed out of the COVID-19 dilemma.

Your proposal to proceed with virtual proceedings to the extent suggested, compromises our role as lawyers. Justice cannot be practiced by lawyers by looking at one another or communicating with one another by looking at a screen. Litigants and lawyers have the right to be in a courtroom experiencing the administration of justice personally, not by a virtual appearance.



I want to be a "lawyer" not just a body on a screen and  
object to virtual proceedings unless absolutely necessary.
